Dear brothers and sisters at St. Peter,

I'd like to share the next article in our newsletter series on the <u>blessings of marriage</u>. This series by Pastor Bruce McKenney was originally featured in our synod's magazine, "Forward in Christ":

"Pastor, we're not quite sure about how soon to have children. Children are a lot of work and cost a lot of money." I was a little surprised when I first heard it, but it's becoming a more common theme among young couples in pre-marriage counseling.

With God-pleasing motives, family planning can be an important part of a couple's happiness in marriage. But in a society that talks about children being an "expense" rather than a "bundle of joy" or a burden to a lifestyle rather than a blessing to a family, God's people need to go back to the basics of God's Word about marriage and how children are part of his plan for it.

One of the purposes and blessings of marriage is children. After creating man and woman and instituting marriage, God blessed them with the ability to reproduce. To the man and woman he said, "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth" (Genesis 1:28). It was and still is part of God's order of creation to grant new human life through the sexual union of husband and wife. That's one of the purposes for which God established marriage and one of the purposes for which a man and woman get married.

Why does God give children to parents, whether by birth or adoption? Through moms and dads, God wants to channel blessings to children for both body and soul. It is the God-given responsibility for parents to take care of the basic bodily needs of children. Clothes, food, shelter, education, and heath care are just a few things that children need, and it is through the family that God wants those basic physical needs met.

But the greater blessings that God wants channeled to children through marriage are the blessings for the soul. How eternally sad it is for children if parents give them bread to eat but do not instruct them about the Bread of Life and sit with their children in church, teaching them how to worship! How eternally sad it is if children have clothes on their backs, but they have not been clothed with the robe of Christ's righteousness through the sacrament of Holy Baptism! Blessed are children whose parents strive with God's help to practice what Paul preached in Ephesus: "Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring

them up in the training and instruction of the Lord" (Ephesians 6:4).

It is true that raising children demands a lot of parents' time and effort, and it can be a source of tension between parents at times. Good parenting begins by moms and dads being on the same page when it comes to priorities and discipline for their children. What more important or sacred work is there for parents than to take care of the precious lambs Jesus gives them?

The best place to start is by providing a home in which children see that Mom and Dad love each other, read God's Word together, and pray regularly. What is even more important is that parent take their children regularly to God's house so that the see and hear that God loves them too. After all, the only thing that parents can take with them to heaven is their children.

Church Council Update—October 21

- The Early Childhood Ministry Committee presented their research and plans to the Church Council. The Council is recommending that the congregation move forward with an ECM to open in Fall 2020. An open forum will be held on Sunday, October 28th. The voters will be deciding if we should go forward with an ECM at 11/4 Voters' Meeting.
- Pastor's Report: Pastor Schewe attended the Asian Ministry Conference in Wisconsin. WELS has 6 Hmong pastors, 3 Korean pastors, 1 Chinese pastor, 2 Vietnamese evangelists, among others, who currently serve in Home Missions. Mornings with Mommy is considering adding a 3rd morning because of growing need.
- Elder's Report—Membership changes: Karl Saethre requested release from membership. Elders recommend John Dickson for membership by affirmation of faith.
- Faith Lutheran—Hmong update: Council continued their discussion on the worship time for the congregation. Faith Lutheran—Hmong will have teams that participate in our building clean-up rotation and lawn care rotation.
- Trustee: We have received one estimate to install solar panels. Trustee explained the financial savings from solar could be significant for our budget but there is an initial cost of installation. Will get another estimate from different solar company.
- Next Voters' Meeting will be on November 4th. Next council meeting is scheduled for November 11th. Leo Schulz would like the congregation to know that they are invited to offer suggestions for issues that the council might address at future meetings.

Record Attendance at Annual OWLS Convention

OWLS at Road America. Record attendance at annual OWLS convention. The Organization of WELS Lutheran Seniors (OWLS) were challenged to "Finish the Race" well when they held their annual convention for seniors in Elkhart Lake, Wis., Oct. 9-12. Elkhart Lake, the home of Road America, is known for its ties to auto racing, relaxation, and history. Attendees were treated to a rare opportunity to ride on the race track or visit the horse-powered world of the Wade House, a historic

stage coach inn. The convention had 207 attendees from around the United States, which exceeded attendance for many recent years.

For over a decade, the OWLS have used their offerings to support the WELS European Civilian chaplaincy, which serves military personnel and WELS civilians in Europe. This year, the OWLS presented Military Services with a check for \$52,000 for work in Europe. Two convention offerings and record proceeds from a silent auction were directed for next year's gift to the work of the chaplain in Europe as well.


