Dear brothers and sisters at St. Peter,

Are you ready to do Christmas?

People often speak of the Christmas season in those terms. "We're going up to our cousins' in the Bay area to 'do Christmas.'" What does that mean? Usually, it means that we'll put on our new Christmas socks and sweater, drive up to see some extended family, exchange presents, eat some Christmas goodies, and head back home in the evening.

There certainly is nothing wrong with visiting relatives and enjoying some Christmas traditions during the upcoming season. In fact, we're often reminded at Christmastime that we should reach out to those we love more often than we do.

November Council Meeting Update (11/12/17)

- After much discussion, the council tentatively approved allowing a Parkinson's Support Group to use Luther Hall for their monthly meeting in January and March provided that all questions about insurance coverage are resolved.
- Outreach: Looking into forming an Outreach committee to discuss Early Childhood Ministry options for our church. Also considering starting a Farmer's Market booth in Clovis. We are planning to move forward with getting a team of 3-4 MLC students for a week to help with outreach.
- Trustee: Next campus clean up is November 25th.
 Working with sign company to improve our signage around the campus.
 TV mount in the sanctuary is scheduled for December 12th.
 Distributed "Church Property Wish List" to all members in church mailboxes.
 Purchased new cart to transport tables.
- Elder's Report: Phil and Amanda Harville were approved as new members.
- Offering from the Advent & Lent mid-week services will go to tuition support for Emily & Rachel Schewe as they are studying to become called workers. Justin Shrum was the previous recipient of the offering to pay his tuition costs, but has since graduated from the seminary.
- At the Special Voters' Meeting on November 19th, the 2018 budget was approved by the voters.
- Next council meeting is scheduled for December 10th. Don Sweetman would like the congregation to know that they are invited to offer suggestions for issues that the council might address at future meetings.

Reformation Worship Focuses on God's Grace

A year ago, in anticipation of the celebration of the 500th anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation, initial plans were made for a large celebration in Milwaukee that would include conferences for all WELS called workers and a large festival worship service for called workers and WELS members in the 15,000- seat Bradley Center. After determining the huge cost of such an event, the decision was made not to hold the event as hoped but to encourage districts and regions to plan for local celebrations that would be less costly and enable more people to participate.

That decision was blessed by God. During the last two weekends, more than 20 districts and regions held special Refor-

mation 500 worship services. The events were very well attended and provided many more people the opportunity to join in this celebration than would have been possible with one centralized event. In each case, worshipers had the opportunity to thank and praise God for the blessings of the Lutheran Reformation. Worshipers were reminded that "grace alone, faith alone, Scripture alone" is not just a slogan or motto, but the heart and center of what connects us to "Christ alone."
