Dear brothers and sisters at St. Peter,

For this month of February, when families celebrate the gift of love that God has blessed us with, we conclude our newsletter series on marriage. This series by Pastor Bruce McKenney was originally featured in our synod's magazine, **"Forward in Christ."** Here is the final installment, focusing on how we all honor marriage:

*"God says, 'Marriage should be honored by all!' (Hebrews 13:4)*

*Two thoughts stand out as we read these words. First, marriage should be honored. God instituted marriage for the well-being of his creation, and through it he wants to channel the blessings of companionship, chastity, and children. Therefore marriage should be considered something of great value. God values marriage highly and so should we! Second, marriage is something on which all should place a high value, both those who are married and those who are not.*

*How do we honor marriage? Here is a brief 'to-do' list.*

*All can honor marriage by listening to and learning what God's Word teaches about it. The listening and learning starts in confirmation classes as pastors teach the Ten Commandments. But it continues when marriage and family life are taught and reviewed in Bible classes marriage enrichment workshops, and even through sermon series. Like other Bible truths, what God says about marriage needs to be taught and retaught, learned and relearned. We live in a world that is dismantling marriage and the family and encourages all to follow its example. God's people, however, need to listen more to what God says about marriage and less to what the world is saying.*

*God established marriage because he loves humans—men and women—and because he wants them to experience human love in a committed, lifelong relationship. God's people want to show God their love by living in marriage according to his Word.*

*Spouses show their love for God and each other when they live together and love each other according to God's design of marriage. Moms and dads show love for their children when they provide an example of a God-pleasing marriage. It's the most important way to teach their children how to live in marriage. The home is a classroom of the Holy Spirit in which*

*parents model for children what God demands and what God promises to those who are married. Parents are the primary teachers of the next generation of those who will get married.*

*But living according to God's design also is a clear and loving testimony to the outside world of what marriage is according to God's Word and a loving reproof of the lifestyles and attitudes that oppose God's will regarding marriage and the family.*

*Another thing that God's people can do to honor marriage is by lifting up their hands in prayer. For those what are still awaiting marriage, ask God for patience and guidance in finding a God-fearing spouse. For those who are married, lift up your voice in prayer and ask God to help you live in marriage according to his will. Parents, it's never too early to pray that your children will find God-fearing spouses. And it's never too late to ask for God's blessings on your children who are already married.*

*Finally, and most important, we honor marriage when we honor our Savior by looking to him for forgiveness. We all fail when it comes to honoring marriage. But the good news is that we can look to Jesus for full and complete forgiveness for sins in marriage too. His forgiveness will restore joy and love to marriage.*

# Church Council & Voters' Meeting Update

- Pastor's Report: Pastor will be attending a pastoral conference from Jan. 27-29 at Shepherd of the Hills, Las Vegas, NV
- Financial Report: End of year total expenses were \$187,782 compared to budgeted \$177,375. Total in bank in checking is \$28,382, not including funds in designated accounts like ECM. Total undesignated offerings for year were \$203,505.
- Elder's Report—Brian and June Lewis and Bernita Krumbach have requested release from membership as they have moved out of the area.
- Outreach Report: Emphasis on door to door campaign by members
- Stewardship chairman handed a copy of updated Talent Survey Sheets to all chairman for their use and encourage us to contact people from the list for help.
- Trustee - working on estimate for 2 new front doors for the sanctuary - an anonymous donor gave \$5000 pay for them. New sprinklers were installed east of Luther Hall to expand our lawn - \$2500 was donated by a church member to pay for the work. Three estimates have been gathered for us to consider installing solar panels on the roof of Luther Hall.
- The Early Childhood Ministry Action Committee is comprised of Pastor and Vicki Schewe, Ellen Gates, Travis and Catherine Hambleton, Barry White, and Mike Farley. The purpose of that committee is to proceed with the work the voters approved in order for us to open an ECM in Fall 2020. First jobs include a fire alarm system, classroom wall, and fire exit door.
- The next council meeting is scheduled for February 10th. Leo Schulz would like the congregation to know that they are invited to offer suggestions for issues that the council might address at future meetings.



## Greeting Cards Available



## ECM Action Team Update

The new ECM Action Team is meeting regularly, the new committee for 2019 that has been tasked with carrying out the work laid out at the fall Voters Meeting that is necessary for opening a Christian pre-school by August 2020.

Some highlights:

- During our Holiday Fund Drive, about \$66,000 in gifts and pledges were made toward the new pre-school. Praise God for this!
- The city of Clovis has approved our plan to open a pre-school.
- A fire alarm (required) is presently being designed, to be installed in the spring.
- Plans are being discussed by the ECM Action team regarding playground specifics, the wall and classroom space in Luther Hall, and a required fire exit door. These plans will be submitted for approval and permitting when they are ready.
