Early Childhood Ministry (ECM) Committee Update

The St. Peter ECM Committee has been meeting since January. Its assignment has been to discuss the possibility and feasibility of whether our church should consider opening an Early Childhood Ministry center, more simply termed a Christian pre-school. Such pre-schools are a common way many of our WELS churches are teaching the gospel to children directly in their mission to spread the Word, and an outreach opportunity in inviting young families to Sunday worship and the other ministries a church offers.

Our ECM Committee has been made up of: Jeff & Helen Hanson, Mike & Leslie Fitzgerald, and Pastor Schewe. In April, the committee will be expanding to add Ellen Gates, John & Teresa Barber, and Matt & Shay Evers. The committee has been following the discussion guide provided by our Wisconsin Synod called *"Building Blocks."*

The next step of discussion involves: Personal interviews and pulse group discussions with church members to see what questions they might have about the potential for this ministry at St. Peter and what their initial reaction is; researching

other preschools near us in Clovis to see what they are doing and how they do it, researching our neighborhood's demographics, and preparing a recommendation for the congregation regarding whether to proceed with more discussion about opening an ECM at St. Peter or not. The ECM Committee is also recommending that Mike Fitzgerald be ratified as the chairman of the ECM Committee.

Stay tuned for information on when interviews and pulse group opportunities will be coming this spring and summer. If you have any questions, let Pastor Schewe know. May God bless our congregational discussions and research on whether we should pursue this ministry of gospel proclamation and outreach.

March Council Meeting Update (3/18/18)

- The following council positions are open for nominations and elections: President, Vice President, Secretary, Financial Secretary, Elders (2), Education, Stewardship. The nominating committee will be announcing a slate of names for the April voter's meeting.
- The church council has decided that the offering from the Lenten mid-week services will go to tuition support for Emily & Rachel Schewe as they are studying to become called workers.
- Outreach: An Outreach committee met to discuss Early Childhood Ministry options for our church. They have completed part 1 of 5 from the WELS Planning Binder. They will continue with their discussions. There is also research being done to possibly have a church booth 1-2 weeks per month at the Clovis Farmers Market.
- Fresno Parkinson's Support Group had their first meeting on 3/10/18 in Luther Hall. They will continue to meet the 2nd Saturday of every month from 10-12:00. They have committed to use the building from March—July.
- The council has decided to bring the issue of the pew fund to the voters. At the April voters' meeting, the voters will be asked to decide whether the pew fund should continue in its current state, or be released into the general fund/special projects in accordance with the wishes of the people who donated to the pew fund.
- Elder's Report: Scott Crossfield requested a release of his membership. Brooke Teixeira has requested a transfer in from The Spring in Reno, NV.
- Communion Sundays in April will be on the 2nd and 4th Sundays (4/8 and 4/22).
- Next council meeting is scheduled for April 8th. Don Sweetman would like the congregation to know that they are invited to offer suggestions for issues that the council might address at future meetings.

New World Mission in South America

This summer two missionaries from the One Latin America (1LA) mission team will be moving to Ecuador. This will be the first time WELS will have an active mission presence in the South American country. Rev. Nathan



Schulte and Rev. Phil Strackbein have begun making arrangements to make the move. Schulte currently serves in Mexico, and Strackbein serves in Bolivia.

The missionaries' first priorities will be to find a location for a Christian training center while also settling in themselves and doing boots-on-the-ground work, meeting their neighbors and learning more about the community.



Appeals Court to Hear Case on Clergy Housing Allowance

For many years the federal government has allowed ministers of the gospel, as defined by the IRS, to deduct the cost of housing from their salaries (often referred to as the "Clergy Parsonage Allowance"). Last year, a lawsuit challenging this tax benefit was filed in a federal court in Wisconsin, arguing that this benefit provided to clergy is unconstitutional. The court ruled with the plaintiffs and declared that the IRS could no longer provide this exemption.

The case was immediately appealed by the Federal Government and will come before a federal appeals court in the coming months. The Church Alliance, an organization of church benefit plan administrators, has filed a "friend of the court" brief in support of the appeal. WELS has expressed its support for this appeal and is also participating in the effort with the Church Alliance organization. While we recognize that this benefit, like other tax exemptions, is not one that we can demand from our government, we are very much aware of the benefits that this provides to those who serve in our synod as ministers of the gospel. Regardless of the outcome, we trust that the Lord of the Church will continue to provide for the needs of those who serve him in gospel ministry.
