Member Profile—The Ergo Family

Marcus and Amanda Ergo were married for twelve years before Marcus died of cancer in October of 2010. They have two sons: twelve-year-old Zachary, and nineyear-old James. Amanda was confirmed at St. Peter where her family attended for many years. After Marcus and Amanda moved back to the Central Valley from Reno (where they lived for two years), they began attending St. Peter. The family enjoys learning and growing in faith, especially with the Sunday School program. A highlight of their week is singing and playing with friends at St. Peter.

The Ergos enjoy their simple, small-town life in Kingsburg. They live in a little fixer-upper cottage they discovered sixteen years ago. Amanda and the boys enjoy being outdoors working in the yard, growing pumpkins, sunflowers and succulents, or digging in their dirt fort. With so many family members living in the same town, family get-togethers are almost constant. (Cousin Jack has "his" spot at the counter for meals.)

Even though their lives are simple, the pace is not slow. Zachary and James are involved in many school and after-school activities. Zachary is in his fifth year of piano lessons. He also plays the clarinet and oboe. James is in his fourth year of piano at Reedley School of Music. He has also started guitar lessons and really has shown a natural talent for it. Zachary and James both swim for the Kingsburg Sea Wolves. This year they started to participate in the Kingsburg 4H program and



enjoy their horticulture and poultry groups. They recently became chicken farmers and have 9 chickens! Amanda, a former high school teacher, acts as "support staff" to Zachary and James.





Dear brothers and sisters at St. Peter,

What do you know about St. Peter Catechism classes?

This is the time of year when confirmations are happening around out synod, so perhaps it's a fitting time to update you on our church's Catechism instruction.

Before a youth is ready for confirmation, they're instructed for anywhere from two to four years. I'm planning to have students for three years of Catechism class before they're confirmed. During each of the first two years, half of the Catechism material is covered, along with material on Martin Luther's life and the Wisconsin Synod. In the third year, the entire Catechism is taught, to reinforce the doctrines learned and to allow for deeper discussion questions for the older kids.

This model allows for students to be combined during the first two years, and for the oldest students (year 3) to have their own, more advanced lecture and discussion time. During years 2 and 3 of Catechism, students are also required to write one-page sermon summaries of a number of Sunday sermons during the year.

This year, Abigail Schewe has been taking her final year of Catechism instruction. Before Confirmation Day, it's also a custom in Lutheran circles to examine youth confirmands to give them a chance to express their faith



and exhibit what they have learned in their studies. Abigail will be examined in the May 28 church service by way of questions and answers, and also by reading essays that she has written about various doctrines.

Confirmation Day is then scheduled for June 4. After that ceremony, Abigail will

be a communicant member of the congregation and our Wisconsin Synod.

Our Junior Catechism class has had three students this past year, all of whom are taking their first year of Catechism instruction. The students are Zachary Ergo, Jonathan Farley, and Jada Gregg. We meet on Wednesdays at 4:00 pm during the regular school year.

Next year, God willing, these three will be in their second year of class and any 6th graders will be eligible to join them. No confirmands will be ready at the end of next year, but after the following year these three would be ready for examination and confirmation.

It is such a blessing to teach these young people! They are eager to learn, and to talk about the teachings of God's Word and how they apply to their lives.

May God continue to bless the youth of our church and build up their faith in the Scriptures so that they might be "wise for salvation!"

Martin Luther College Celebrates Graduation

On May 13, 145 students earned degrees marking the completion of their ministerial training at Martin Luther College, New Ulm, Minn. This included 29 bachelor of arts (preseminary) degrees, 89 bachelor of science in education degrees (including 16 early childhood education), 5 bachelor of science degrees, and 4 seminary certifications. In addition, 18 students received their master of science in education degree.



MLC President Rev. Mark Zarling presented the commencement sermon on the theme, "Courage for the Commission." The sermon text chosen by the class, John 16:33, states: "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In

Mr. Lee Hitter, director of WELS Communications, says he is thrilled to see WELS congregations take advantage of this

opportunity to highlight God's grace and the anniversary of the Reformation in their communities. "The reaction from our members that have seen the film is tremendous," he says. "Every Lutheran should make it a priority to see it on the big screen. Celebrating the 500th anniversary of the Reformation is one of those once-in-a-lifetime experiences."

Northwestern Publishing House is offering many resources connected to the film, including DVDs of the actual movie in November.



Pastor Charles & Connie Cortright

Pastor Charles Cortright was the pastor of St. Peter when we were just a small mission church meeting in a sandwich shop and later in a school auditorium. He left St. Peter in March 1990 after accepting a call to the east coast. He has served at our WELS pastoral college and several other congregations since.

Pastor Cortright just recently accepted a call to serve in Europe. He and Connie are now living in Prague, Czech Republic. He will be a missionary and theological educator in the Eurasia region. He will be "helping to strengthen Lutheran pastors to bring Jesus to de-Christianized Europe." He will be working at first with a young vicar in Romania, mentoring him to become the only confessional Lutheran pastor who will preach in Romanian. Sorin-Horia Trifa lives in Bucharest, Romania. So while their home base is in Prague, they will be traveling there to work with him.
