Dear brothers and sisters at St. Peter,

Do you like to wait? And wait a long time?

Not many people do. Waiting often involves frustration, boredom, anxiety, and more.

I'm reminded of this as we stand on the cusp of the longest season of the entire Church Year, the Pentecost season. This church season stretches from the beginning of June to the end of October. A long time!

Why so long? Perhaps some background would help. The first half of the Church Year is all about the life and ministry of Jesus Christ. From the beginning of Advent through the end of the Easter season, we recount the events of Jesus' life, death, resurrection, and ascension. All these events are treasures to us, for they tell the story of how our salvation was won. Jesus lived a perfect life and suffered, died, and rose to redeem us from our sins and to assure us of a place in our heavenly home.

Then comes the second half of the Church Year, which is almost entirely the Pentecost season. This part of the Church Year focuses on the Christian's life. Our life now is fueled by the events of Pentecost Day, when the Holy Spirit was poured out on the New Testament Church in a special way. This same Holy Spirit has converted us and sanctified us. Now, he lives in us. Often, sermons on faith, prayer, stewardship, Christian service, suffering, and more can be heard in this season. We are encouraged to fight the good fight of faith.

As the Sundays of the Pentecost season go on and on through the summer and fall months, we can also be reminded that we are waiting.

What more needs to happen in God's plan of this world's history? Only he knows. As we live in these end times, nothing more must be completed to earn our salvation. We are waiting for the return of Christ at the end of time. He is coming soon, we know, yet to our finite minds the wait can seem long. The Church prays, "Even so, Lord, quickly come!"

The Church also continues its important work of spreading the gospel message that Jesus gave us. All sinners need to hear this message. In fact, this is a reason that our Savior has not returned yet. More people need to hear this message and believe.

- Voters' Meeting (4/29/18):
- 1. Voters approved the *required* change of mortgage payment schedule. We will no longer be receiving a special interest rate. We will be receiving a standard rate.
- 2. The new slate of council-recommended officers was elected: President—Leo Schulz; Vice President—Joshua Bornemann; Recording Secretary—Travis Armstrong; Financial Secretary—Norm Vander Poel; Elder—Ken Hoffmeyer; Elder—Jeff Hansen; Education Secretary—John Barber; Outreach—Don Sweetman; Stewardship—Bob Dickson; Trustee—Barry Burghardt; Trustee—Curtis Garner
- 3. The Pew Fund totaling \$8,350 was converted in the budget to a general Capital Improvements fund.
- Council Meeting (5/20/18)
- 1. Membership Changes: Michael May and Barry White will be welcomed as members (adult confirmation) on June 3rd. Bernita Krumbach was welcomed by Affirmation of Faith on May 6th.
- 2. A committee is being formed to plan the celebration of the 30th anniversary of the dedication of our sanctuary (May 22, 1988). Celebration will be held on June 10th.
- 3. Outreach is researching having a booth at the Clovis Farmer's Market (last Friday of each month.)
- 4. Family Story Time is being planned for the summer. Tuesday evenings at 6:30pm. July 10-August 7
- 5. Pastor Schewe is planning a vacation for June 14-28. On June 17th, Pastor Jonathan Stern will be preaching and doing a presentation on our synod's ministries. On June 24th, the service will be led by an elder with a video sermon.
- Next council meeting is scheduled for July 8th. Leo Schulz would like the congregation to know that they are invited
 to offer suggestions for issues that the council might address at future meetings.

The Lord Blesses Hmong Outreach in Vietnam



It all started when a leader within the Hmong Fellowship Church (HFC) in Vietnam viewed an online sermon by Rev. Bounkeo Lor. The message of pure grace through Jesus Christ was something he had never heard before – and he wanted to learn more. He invited Rev. Lor to come to Vietnam to train himself and others in the truth of the gospel.

With every visit Rev. Lor has made to conduct training in Hanoi, approximately 60 church leaders have attended to learn more about the truths of the Bible. These same 60 leaders have been taking the message back to their congregations, and the gospel message is accomplishing its purpose. The HFC grown from 65,000 to 100,000 members and formed 53 new churches. The gospel can work even in the most difficult of circumstances, and sometimes in ways we cannot expect. The Lord has blessed this outreach, and the Vietnamese government has invited WELS to build a theological training facility in the capital city of Hanoi. WELS is currently the only protestant church with official governmental permission to work with the Hmong in Vietnam. WELS Missions representatives will be visiting Hanoi, Vietnam in June to evaluate and explore this opportunity further, and efforts to secure funding for land acquisition, construction costs, and initial operation costs have begun.
