

Dear brothers and sisters at St. Peter,

I was vividly reminded of something the other day. It happened during a stretch break.

Every so often, I do like to take a stretch break. After 45 minutes or an hour of desk work, I find it refreshing and mind-clearing to get up from my office desk, walk a couple laps around Luther Hall, or even poke my head outside for a few deep breaths.

I poked my head outside the other morning. For some reason my eyes began to take note of the cars passing by our property, especially on Gettysburg Avenue. I watched for a couple minutes. Car after car passed by. I tried to imagine how many people drive by our church in the course of a day or a week. I am certain it is in the THOUSANDS.

Our founders here at St. Peter knew what they were doing when they purchased this piece of property. I'm sure it might have been more cost-effective to look into property off the main roads, or bordered by only one main road. But at that time, a lot of a few acres was purchased on the corner of two main arterials in a growing part of Clovis. THOUSANDS and TENS OF THOUSANDS of cars, joggers, and dog walkers pass by this property during the course of a couple weeks.

Why bring this up? It served as a good reminder to me. First, I thank God that those before us (and some still among us!) laid out and built the attractive campus that we have. This is a good encouragement for all of us to continue to contribute our time and effort to keep our property looking sharp, and thinking of ways to enhance it. I do think our property leaders lead us well in this area, and I thank God for them also.

Secondly, I continue to think about how vital it is for us to analyze our church signage and enhance this so that people can see clearly who we are and what we are doing here. Driving east on Gettysburg Avenue or north on Temperance Avenue, it's virtually impossible to notice us unless you're not stopped by a red light. Even coming south or east toward our property, it's no bargain that a driver will notice us.

This is not brought up as an indictment against anyone from the past. Sign design has changed over the years, and back when our current sign was installed, I'm certain it was designed according to the codes back then.

However, codes change, and we have an audience out there that needs to see us. More traffic and walkers are passing by than ever. In addition, we are enhancing our ministries - especially our children's ministries - with a message we don't want to be a secret. Vacation Sunday School, Family Storytime, and "Mornings with Mommy" are all programs that we want our neighborhood to know about.

Travis Hambleton, our property chairman, met recently with a Fresno sign consultant here at our property to talk about possibilities with our signage on the corner, the concept of having a sign with moving text for changing announcements, and what options might be desirable for the other corners of our property—by our driveway and to the south on Temperance Avenue.

I'm excited about those discussions. They are only discussions and proposals right now, but I'd hope you'd share my excitement. We have a mission field that passes by us every single day on the way to work at the hospital or running errands into town. Our signage and appearance could be one of the biggest advantages we have in our outreach efforts, due to our visible location.

Stay tuned for information that's being gathered on this. Such projects take planning, and they also do not come free. Quality, attractive signage costs money. But as I think about all those cars I saw that morning, I know that it can be a great enhancement to our visibility and to meeting many of our neighbors as we look to share the word about Jesus with those around us!

Church Council Meeting Update (7/9/17 meeting)

- Discussion was held regarding the dissolving of the Clovis Hmong congregation. Pastor Thao and his family will be moving in early August to the Kansas City area to be near family, as there is much to do caring for his aging parents.
- The Schewes will be in Wisconsin and Minnesota getting their kids to school from August 10-24. Pastor John Boehringer will be preaching for the two Sundays that Pastor Schewe will be gone.
- Trustee presented a list of projects that could be on a "wish list." Members could provide an additional offering to pay for these projects that go beyond the normal budget. The list will be presented to the voters at the meeting in July.
- We received a \$10,000 anonymous donation that was designated toward paying our debt. Our loan balance is currently \$297,973.
- Next council meeting is scheduled for August 9. Don Sweetman would like the congregation to know that they are invited to offer suggestions for issues that the council might address at future meetings.

Congregations vote for the annual mission project each spring. The selected missions receive money at the annual convention. The missions that are not selected receive money from the annual

LWMS publishes a mission projects booklet that contains world and home mission projects. Our congregation can use this tool when selecting mission projects for women's groups, Sunday school, preschool, youth group, or day school.
